Created in 1923, the Syndicat des Eaux d'Île-de-France (SEDIF) is a public institution that provides drinking water to 4 million residents of the Île-de-France, making it France's largest drinking water public service. As the organising authority, project owner and full owner of all its facilities, SEDIF makes major decisions in an open manner for the benefit of its users.



OUR INVESTMENTS

To remain innovative, SEDIF is going to set up a highperformance membrane filtration treatment stage within its 3 main plants by 2030/2032.

These extremely fine filtration water treatment method will allow for unprecedented water quality without any plastic residue.

The "Towards a purer, scale-free, chlorine-free water" project has two objectives :

- strengthening sanitary risk management by removing more micropollutants and PFAS
- improving user comfort with a softer, less chlorinated water.

This is the flagship project of the "Smart SEDIF" investment plan, set over several years.



WATER PRICING



Over the past 20 years, the share of drinking water equivalent to the SEDIF's service has seen the most moderate increase, well below inflation levels.

Reflecting the wishes of elected officials, SEDIF is able to keep prices under control for the benefits of its users thanks to concession management and strictly defined contract modalities

ENVIRONMENTAL ACTIONS

Protecting the environment and biodiversity is a non-negotiable for SEDIF. Due to the very nature of its operations, it is directly dependent on the quality and quantity of water resources. Optimizing energy consumption and increasing the production of renewable energies, reducing greenhouse gas emissions and the use of resources, preserving water and biodiversity, adapting to climate change and ensuring access to water are the main areas of focus of the SEDIF's quality, environment and sustainability policy. Adopted in December 2024, the 2030 Climate, Water and Energy Plan provides a formal framework for these ambitions.

SOLIDARITY ACTIONS

SEDIF is aware of its responsibilities. In 2011, it created the Eau Solidaire (United Waters) program to support struggling users, helping them switch to eco-friendly habits and providing financial aid to pay their water bills or fees. A yearly budget of 2.5 million euros (equivalent to 1 % of water sales revenue) is allocated to the implementation of the program, which has helped nearly 70,000 families thus far.

Since 1986, SEDIF is also committed to international action to improve access to water in developing countries. It allocates 1.15 euro cent per cubic meter of water sold to cooperative actions in Africa and Asia, in partnership with NGOs. Since its inception, the Solidarité Eau (Water Solidarity) program has funded 50 million euros worth of actions and has benefited over 5 million people in some twenty countries.
